HSAR is hosting a training Expo at the Houston Airport, August 14,15 & 16. This event will involve SAR members from all RDBN SAR groups and SAR members outside the region. A highlight of the event will be the arrival of three PEP Air search planes for a demonstration and training session, August 15. Registration numbers are already higher than we expected. HSAR will provide meals Friday, Saturday and Sunday breakfast. Our request is for funding to cover the cost of purchasing the food for the event. HSAR volunteers will cook the food under the supervision of a volunteer who is a caterer by trade. Attached is the poster for the event.



Describe how this proposal will benefit the community:

In northern BC, Search and Rescue groups (SAR) face a greater challenge given the expansive geographic area we serve in comparison to southern BC. We have fewer groups, less volunteers, less funding and groups are separated by great distances. Additionally search and rescue occurrences have increased with more people working, recreating and exploring our northern regions.

This summer Houston SAR is hosting a SAR Expo, we have invited SAR groups throughout our region as well as PEP Air and other outlining associations from Prince George to Prince Rupert and Stewart to all come together and meet for training on August 14, 15, and 16 to improve our emergency response capabilities..

The purpose of the Expo is to create an opportunity for regional SAR groups to network and train together during a full weekend of SAR practice scenarios and exercises with the goals of:

• Learning from each other's skills and capabilities to be better prepared to work together in actual emergency situations.

• Comparing and standardizing processes and protocols between groups to better manage emergencies safely and efficiently.

• Familiarizing volunteers with other group's equipment and member training levels to improve opportunities to share equipment and human resources.

• Exposing new volunteers to working with senior more skilled volunteers for training and mentoring opportunities.

Direct regional benefits:

• Increased volunteer cooperation. Better volunteer relief and support capabilities across the region during emergencies.

• Better utilization of existing equipment and volunteer coordination.

• Training and knowledge sharing across regional SAR groups.

Thank you for supporting ABC Communications in our application towards the Industry Canada Connecting Canadians Program. ABC has been successfully in its application with a conditional award from Industry Canada. In addition to this Federal program the Province launched the Connecting British Columbia Program to assist with additional funding towards Rural Broadband development in British Columbia.

ABC applied to the Northern Development Initiative Trust for the Connecting British Columbia Program. ABC has been conditionally awarded funding based on our application submission to Industry Canada. Climate discussion paper open for public review

VICTORIA – British Columbians are invited to review and comment on a newly released discussion paper that considers the ideas, values and priorities they want to see in a new climate action plan.

British Columbia is in the process of developing a new Climate Leadership Plan to ensure the province remains a climate leader and meets its 2020 and 2050 emissions-reduction targets.

In May 2015, government appointed a Climate Leadership Team consisting of leaders from the business, academic and environmental communities, as well as First Nations and local governments, to review options for economic development and greenhouse-gas emissions reductions, and also make recommendations for the new Climate Leadership Plan.

The public will have two opportunities over the next six months to participate in shaping new climate policies in B.C. During the first opportunity that runs until Aug. 17, 2015, people can comment on the discussion paper.

After reviewing discussion paper submissions and the Climate Leadership Team's recommendations, government will release a draft Climate Leadership Plan in December 2015. British Columbians will have a chance to review the draft plan and will be asked to provide comment on specific policies and actions regarding climate change.

Government will release the final Climate Leadership Plan in March 2016.
