Recommendation:

"That Bylaw 84 (Annual Budget for 2022 and Provisional Budget for 2023) be given third reading this 10th day of February 2022 as amended."

Discussion:

At the last meeting, the Directors requested several taxation options be brought for consideration. Each 2% of a potential budget increase will provide just over \$100,000 in additional taxation requisition.

The recommendation includes a 4% requisition increase over the budget presented in the first two readings of the budget bylaw. This change will result in \$204,150 in additional tax requisition. With the CPI for British Columbia being 3.9% and the cost in institutional construction increasing year over year over 10%, an increase in the requisition is likely prudent.

A 6% tax increase will result in \$306,225 of additional tax requisition.

The Hospital District taxation between the classes remain largely unchanged from last year. There has been substantial new construction in both residential and utilities and there has also been a considerable increase in the market value of residential properties. These changes have not significantly impacted the "split in taxation"

between the different property classes. These changes are illustrated in Chart 2 and Chart 3 below.

Residential	15%
Utility	31%
Industrial	-2%
Commercial	4%
Other	-5%
Total	13%

While new construction and market increases have increased residential assessments by 15% and utility assessments by 31%, these changes have not resulted in a significant change in taxation distribution between residential properties and the remaining property classes. Essentially, pipeline construction in the Electoral Areas has balanced the increase in the market value of the residential properties.
