

CONSTRUCTION / DEMOLITION WASTE DISPOSAL POLICY

Bylaw No. 1764 regulates the disposal of, and allows for the application of tipping fees for the disposal of construction/demolition (C/D) and land clearing waste at Regional District Landfills and Transfer Stations.

Loads greater than 2 cubic metres $(2m^3)$ (volume equal to conventional unmodified pick-up truck box) of materials defined as C/D and land clearing waste will \underline{NOT} be accepted for disposal at Regional District Transfer Stations.

Disposal of C/D and land clearing waste in amounts greater than 2 cubic metres (2m³) will be restricted to Regional District Landfills, where a tipping fee of \$90 per tonne (includes applicable taxes) will be applied.

C/D and land clearing waste in amounts less than two cubic metres (2m₃) will be accepted for disposal at Regional District Landfills and Transfer Stations free of charge.

Segregated loads of recyclable materials (eg. metals and clean wood waste) will still be accepted at Regional District Landfills and Transfer Stations free of charge.

Construction / demolition (C/D) waste is defined as, "residual, non-recycled wastes produced from the construction, renovation or demolition of residential and commercial buildings and other structures and usually includes asphalt, concrete, wood, pipe, electrical wire, drywall, shingles, glass, insulation, plastic packaging and does not include regular household waste, hazardous waste, asbestos, contaminated soils, non-contaminated soils or liquid waste".

Land clearing waste is defined as, "residual, non-recyclable wastes produced from the clearing of land and usually includes wood stumps, branches, wood chips and non-contaminated soil in amounts greater than two cubic metres per single load and does not include regular household waste, hazardous waste, contaminated soils, liquid or asbestos.

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
