Director Miller voiced concems regarding the capacity required to address the number of referrals that are received by the RDBN with high level technical information. He also noted that First Nations communities have similar concerns.

Discussion took place regarding the need for a more transparent and user responsible process in regard to the land use process. Engaging the Union of B.C. Municipalities and North Central Local Government Association to lobby to change the process was discussed. The pipeline companies may have a negative impact in the region in regard to camps, road use, solid waste management, policing, etc. and with proper consultation and due process some of these issues may be mitigated.

Staff are preparing a Rural Dividend Fund Application for the Connectivity in the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako Project and are requesting direction on the project activities from the Rural Directors and Board support for submitting the application.

To assist with project planning and application submission, Staff have met with both Network BC and Strathcona Regional District (SRD) Staff, who are moving forward with a draft Connectivity Strategy. Through these discussions and very preliminary research, Staff are recommending the following project be submitted to the Rural Dividend Fund.

#### Project Details

This project will enable the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako to gain an in-depth understanding of the current service levels in the Region, as well as identify gaps in service to specific geographic locations. This information will enable the RDBN to engage in meaningful communication with residents and ISPs in the area to develop a realistic, unified vision for where the Region can focus its energy and resources to ensure that connectivity in the Region is improved. This will include a strong business case for increased broadband infrastructure, and partnership opportunities with stakeholders to maximize the Region's ability to respond to opportunities for both backbone and last mile infrastructure upgrades.

#### Project Deliverables

- Identification of the regional gaps in connectivity including the current coverage, infrastructure, internet speeds and rates. Recommendations for appropriate and affordable broadband within the RDBN.
- 2) Identification and understanding of the economic and social benefits of increased broadband connectivity in the RDBN.
- 3) Identification of key stakeholders and their roles to create a Regional Connectivity Advisory Group.
- 4) Develop a shared vision and identify next steps to determine the existing and future needs for connectivity in the Region.

#### Project Budget

The Manager of Regional Economic Development would be available for project management and report writing. The Management Intern would be available to provide

research and report writing support. The GIS Technician would be available for map generation. A budget of \$20,000 should be expected for a consultant to be hired to provide technical expertise and report content where required. A budget of \$5,000 should be expected to host 3-7 workshops across the region to gather input and identify stakeholders for a Regional Connectivity Advisory Group.

If approved, the Rural Dividend Fund will contribute \$10,000. The RDBN would contribute the In-Kind value for the Management Intern, Manager of Regional Economic Development and GIS Technician (already in the 2017/18 Budget). In addition, the RDBN would contribute \$10,000 - 15,000, included by the Board in the 2017 Budget under "Special Projects".

#### Timeline

Staff would be able to begin work on this project in June, 2017. It would be expected that the project would be complete by May, 2018.

We seek to expand our free children's Summer Reading Club program for ages 3-12. We aim to include more off-site activities to reach families who are not yet library users with free literacy-based entertainment. We also aim to visit more offsite locations and community events to reach a broader segment of our community and increase the diversity of the children enrolling in this program, specifically Indigenous children, who are dramatically underrepresented, and Special Needs children.



Describe how this proposal will benefit the community:

Teachers are familiar with an unfortunate phenomenon called "the summer slide". It is common for children to enter school in September having forgotten much of the previous year's learned skills, having not practiced them over the summer. Studies have shown that participation in a literacy-based reading program such as the SRC which encourages children to read every day all summer long can not only stop the summer slide but strengthen academic skills over the long summer holidays. Additionally, many friendships are made at this free program and children form a positive relationship with their library, leading to continued usage. The SRC is free and open to all children whether or not they have a library card or are just visiting relatives in the area.

This project is a weekend painting "retreat" in August 2017 led by a well-known artist, Steven Wilejto. Steven is a high school art teacher and is experienced in teaching painting skills to a variety of skill levels. The program will be open to up to 12 participants. The Village of Granisle has offered space and assistance with promotion as well as a promise to groom some "community ambassadors" who will assist with whatever needs arise. Participants will spend Friday night gathering to meet, discuss the project, determine their site for painting, and go over their art supplies. (A supply list will be provided to participants upon registration.)

Saturday will start with yoga geared to participant level, followed by a painting lesson. A nutritious lunch will be provided for the participants. After lunch students will paint until an agreed upon time when they will reconvene for a critique of their work. Supper will be on their own but the Village has offered to liaise with Babine Lodge to serve a no-host buffet or a "Painting Special" Friday and Saturday evening. Participant appropriate hikes along one of the many hiking trails adjacent to Granisle will be led by Granisle's "community ambassadors" and will be available for those wishing to wear off the calories in the evening. Sunday will start again greeting the morning with yoga followed by a lesson, lunch, an afternoon of painting and painters will reconvene at an agreed upon time for a critique and final farewell.

Describe how this proposal will benefit the community:

Paint the Lake" is an idea put forward by Granisle Village Staff. They have been wanting to offer free or relatively inexpensive recreational programs for their aging population to address isolation and increase socialization.

This project will offer socialization around art and exercise. It will combine knowledge of wellness with activities that will get seniors involved in a visual art and exercise with a group of like-minded individuals. Across Canada, research has shown that over 90% of older adults live independently and wish to remain so. In smaller northern communities, supporting older residents to remain in place can be a challenge. Isolation and lack of external mental and physical stimulation can become a major challenge.

An Access Audit sponsored by the Lakes Outdoor Recreation Society in 2012/13 proved that there is great potential to encourage seniors and people with disabling conditions to socialize while exploring diverse opportunities.



This application is regarding a Crown Grant for roadway purposes in order to build a driveway from Somerset Road to the applicants private lot on Clucluz Lake. The subject property is legally described as Part of District Lot 9288, Cariboo District and is located in the community of Cluculz Lake. The application area is approximately 1.05 ha. in size.



The application area is zoned Recreational (P2) under Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako Zoning Bylaw No. 700, 1993 and designated as Parks and Recreation (P) under Vanderhoof Rural Official Community Plan, Bylaw No. 1517, 2009.

Given the P1 zoning of the land and its close proximity to Somerset Drive staff referred the application to Area 'F' Advisory Planning Commission (APC). Staff were concerned that a road in the proposed location may conflict with present and future recreational use of the land.

The APC has indicated that the proposed driveway would conflict with walking trails used by area residents, and that an existing road from Lloyd Drive to the applicant's property already exists. Therefore, it is recommended that the Province not approve the proposed driveway from Somerset Drive, and that an access from Lloyd Drive be considered. It is further recommended that the Province consult with the local community regarding any new proposed driveway locations.

The formal APC comments will appear on the Supplemental Agenda.





This application is regarding a Licence of Occupation for a logging camp. The subject property is located on unsurveyed crown lands, in the vicinity of Haul Lake, 46 kilometres north from the Village of Granisle. The application area is approximately 11.795 ha. in size.



The applicant is applying for a 10-30 year licence of occupation to build a work camp (Morrison Camp) for forestry workers employed by Pacific Inland Resources (PIR). The Morrison Camp is proposed to house 50-75 workers to be used year round. Construction plans include a sewage lagoon, generator, parking lot and accommodation building. Further details can be found in the attached Management Plan and Site Plan.

# Morrison Camp Management Plan

#### 1.0 BACKGROUND

#### 1.1 Project Overview

Pacific Inland Resources (PIR) will construct a 50-75 man logging camp on this site. Construction will begin this summer, if approval is given, and be completed in the summer of 2018. The camp is expected to use up about 11.8 hectares of the property. The camp will be constructed in several phases: First the water and sewer services will be developed, second the construction of the camp itself, third the installation of generators for power. Once camp is completed then we are planning to connect into the hydro line that runs from Fort Babine to Takla Lake.

#### 1.2 Authorizations, Permits or Approvals

Pacific Inland Resources will obtain all necessary permits that are required by all agencies throughout the construction of the logging camp.

#### 1.3 First Nations

The Licence of Occupation is located within the Lake Babine Nation. This location was identified on Pacific Inland Resources Forest Stewardship Plan maps in the spring of 2017 and info shared with the Lake Babine Nation.

#### 2.0 LOCATION

#### 2.1 General Description

See attached General location Map and Detailed Site plan map

#### 2.2 Location Justification

This site has been selected because it is located approximately in the middle of our logging area and it is within 1 kilometer of the BC Hydro powerline that runs from Fort Babine to Takla Lake. Our existing Morrison camp is now located at the bottom end of our chart area and the camp requires major upgrades since it is 30 plus years old.

#### 2.3 Seasonal Use

The camp will be in use 12 months of the year.

#### 3.0 INFRASTRUCTURE

#### 3.1 New Facilities

Within the Licence of Occupation the following improvements will occur:

- Area will be cleared and leveled for the camp/parking lot/generator and Storage shed
- Approximately 10 prefab Atco camp trailers will be erected
- A building for the generators and storage will be erected
- Sewage lagoons will be constructed to meet the required size of camp.
- A well for water will be drilled on site.
- The existing road into and through the site will be upgraded.
- Eventually we plan to install a powerline from camp to the BC
   Hydro line running from Fort Babine to Takla lake.

#### 3.2 Access

There is an existing logging road accessing the area. This road will be upgraded to provide year round access. Also PIR may apply for a road permit from the end of the road northeast to the 5000 road to facilitate a loop road for our logging trucks that stay in camp.

#### 3.3 Utilities Requirements and Sources

Power for the camp will be provided by diesel generators at the startup of the camp. The plan is to eventually establish a powerline

from the camp to the existing BC Hydro powerline that runs from Fort Babine to Takla lake.

#### 3.4 Water Supply

PIR plans to drill one or more water supply wells to supply water for the required size of camp. All wells drilled will meet all requirements of the Groundwater Protection Regulation.

#### 3.5 Waste Collection, Treatment and Disposal

- The vegetation debris accumulated during the clearing of the site will be disposed of by open burning. PIR will follow the Open Burning Smoke Control Regulation and obtain all necessary approvals.
- All garbage accumulated by the camp is planned to be incinerated and all permits required under the Environmental Management Act will be obtained.
- PIR is planning to develop sewage lagoons for the camp sewage and all permits and requirements of the Sewerage System Regulation will be obtained before construction begins.

#### 4.0 ENVIRONMENTAL

#### 4.1 Land Impacts

#### 4.1.1 Vegetation Removal

The Licence of Occupation is located within a previously harvested cutblock so most of the large timber vegetation has been removed. Remaining vegetation will be removed by excavator or buildozer.

#### 4.1.2 Soil Disturbance

PIR will minimize the disturbance to the soil.

#### 4.1.3 Riparian Encroachment

There is no encroachment on riparian areas within the Licence of Occupation.

#### 4.1.4 Pesticides and Herbicides

No pesticides or herbicides will be utilized on the site.

#### 4.1.5 Visual Impacts

The Licence of Occupation is not located within a visually sensitive area.

#### 4.1.6 Archaeological Sites

The Licence of Occupation is located within a low area for potential Archaeological Sites.

#### 4.1.7 Construction Materials

All construction materials will be transported to the site by trucks. Deleterious impacts will be minimal.

#### 4.2 Atmosperic Impacts

#### 4.2.1 Sound, Odor Gas or Fuel Emissions

No impacts on wildlife or residents in the area.

#### 4.3 Restrictions on Tenuring of Aquatic Lands






