

Livestock Evacuation Alert



If you have a farm and receive an Evacuation Alert, there are a few things you should consider:

Is relocation necessary?

In some circumstances, relocation could put your animals at more risk. If you decide to leave them, make sure they have plenty access to water and feed.



Do you have a relocation site?

Is it safe from the emergency at hand? Make sure it is located outside of the evacuation zone.

If evacuation is necessary

Start arranging transportation for your animals. Move dangerous livestock first. You will not be able to return to your property once the Evacuation Order has been issued, so start the relocation process when you receive the Evacuation Alert.

Safely Store

Equipment, supplies, and infrastructure on your property to reduce delay and promote recovery of farming operations upon return.

Notify your important contacts if relocation is necessary. Let them know where you plan to go.

Extra supplies

If possible, have extra supplies and medication for your livestock.
