The Friends of the Smithers Library (FoSL) has a mission to foster public and corporate support for the Smithers Public Library (SPL) and its continued development; to promote knowledge, understanding and use of the Smithers Public Library services and knowledge of its needs; to encourage donations and bequests to the Library; to fund activities, programs and materials for the Library.

2018 activities included:

- On-going support of children's programs, including Books for Babies, Lego Time, and Story Times
- Community outreach through the Bulkley Valley Exhibition and Trade Show
- Public events including book readings, info sessions, and Campfire Cookout and Sing-Along
- Successful Annual Book Sale with all funds raised going to new book acquisitions

The programs and services made possible by the FoSL serve, via the Smithers Public Library, approximately 13,500 people.

The geographic area includes: Smithers and Benefitting Area/Fire Protection District (7418) RDBN Area "A" (5777) Jean Baptiste 28 (5) Witset* (306)

*Technically, Witset is in the Hazelton Public Library's catchment, however most patrons use the Smithers Public Library because of frequenting Smithers for various services.



The FoSL proposes to fund a Smithers Public Library (SPL) program called the Repair Café. The concept originated in the Netherlands (repaircafe.org) and has successfully spread internationally.

The Repair Café provides space and opportunity for people to bring broken and non-working everyday items for repair, extending the life of consumer goods and reducing waste in our local transfer station. Types of repair possible include: small appliances and electronics, textiles, wood, metal and ceramic objects, musical instruments, and (as outdoor space becomes available in spring) possibly bicycles and small engines.

The model recruits volunteer, skilled handy-people to offer expertise, tools and guidance for individuals to make their own repairs and maintenance. The program is open to everyone and promotion will include outreach to youth, seniors and marginalized people.

FoSL requests \$2,000 to establish and run this program monthly at the Smithers Public Library, for six months (April to September). After the six events, the program's success and value to the community will be evaluated.

Describe how this proposal will benefit the community:

Anticipated benefits to the community include, and are certainly not limited to:

- a. Waste reduction Significant economic and far-reaching environmental benefits are immediate when household items are maintained in use and diverted from the regional transfer station.
- b. Consumer education The Repair Café provides supportive space for hands-on, engaged learning about how things work, how to fix, and how to keep working items in good condition. The human-helping-human model establishes a social and non-intimidating learning environment.
- c. Individual empowerment "Throw-away society" is a term often used to describe our collective, and consumers can feel powerless to change a large cultural trend. Deep satisfaction and increased confidence can come from making tangible improvements and repairs in our lives.
- d. Community connection The people-helping-people model is about human connection, conversation, peer-to-peer learning and weaving the fabric of social change.
- e. Consumer culture-shift Change happens in the small, every-day occurrences the amount of refuse in our landfills can reduce one item at a time. Providing space for people to discuss issues as well as do something concrete to affect a change is a potent combination.
