Northern Health has indicated that they hope to request a bylaw for structural improvements to Stuart-Nechako Manor in October. The costs associated with this project are currently preliminary and confidential; however, the costs will be above the \$1 million capital threshold where Hospital Districts are expected to contribute 40% of the total costs.

Due to the confidential nature of tendering process, further discussions on this topic will be brought forward in-camera. An inspection of the building was completed on Wednesday, September 15th by the Regional District's Chief Building Inspector and by the District of Vanderhoof's Building Inspector. A report is in preparation and will be available under separate cover at the in-camera meeting.
