Dear Gerry Thiessen,

Thank you for your letter dated May 27, 2022, addressed to Premier John Horgan, in which you express your concerns, on behalf of the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako surrounding the issue of human trafficking in B.C. As the Assistant Deputy Minister of the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Branch of the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, with responsibility for victim services across the province, your email has been referred to me.

Our government takes it commitment to combating human trafficking seriously, and we are committed to addressing the root causes by taking steps to reduce poverty and promote gender equality. Human trafficking has a profoundly negative impact on its victims, which is why we are actively involved in the effort to support victims and bring those who exploit individuals to justice.

The Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General supports a number of prevention, intervention and awareness initiatives to address human trafficking, including building local capacity for community agencies to provide support to victims of human trafficking. We also created, and continue to offer, Canada's first online course on human trafficking, Human Trafficking: Canada is Not Immune, to assist in the identification and support of trafficked persons in B.C.

The ministry provides over \$44 million in annual funding to support over 400 victim service and violence against women programs across the province. This includes programs that provide assistance to trafficked persons. In fiscal year 2021/22, through the Civil Forfeiture Crime Prevention and Remediation grant program, the ministry provided over \$420,000 in one-time grants to support community-based projects that address issues related to human trafficking, sexual exploitation, and sex worker safety, including culturally sensitive outreach services for high risk female youth and women (including transgender, non-binary and gender fluid individuals) throughout B.C. who have experienced trafficking or exploitation.

In recent years, this ministry has also led a number of initiatives with funding from the federal Department of Justice's Victims Fund, including the development of a toolkit for frontline service providers about trafficking of youth in B.C., a knowledge exchange event on best practices to prevent and respond to human trafficking, and a Train the Trainer Project in B.C. communities that raised awareness about human trafficking and built local capacity to address these issues.

We also continue to work with our federal, provincial, and territorial partners to strengthen Canada's response to human trafficking by ensuring that our efforts to address this issue are coordinated across jurisdictions.
