Fort Fraser Volunteer Fire Department - New Fire Truck Delivery

Burns Lake, B.C. – The Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako and the community of Fort Fraser recently celebrated the delivery of a brand-new Pierce Fire Engine from Commercial Truck and Equipment during a ceremony on October 15, 2022. Firefighters and local residents gathered to push the truck into the firehall in a traditional Fire Service act of dedication.

The new truck, which will allow the department to be better prepared to respond to fires throughout the Fort Fraser Fire Protection service area, is the first new truck in the department's history. Its purchase was supported by Northern Capital and Planning Grant funding, Capital Reserve Funds, and a generous donation from the Nechako-Kitimaat Development Fund. This made it possible for the truck to be purchased without any additional tax burden for residents in the service area.
