Shelter-In-Place Notices

For some emergencies, it may be safest to stay inside your home or the structure you're in at the time of the threat, so long as it offers a reasonable level of protection.

Actions to take:

- Go inside, close and lock all windows and exterior doors.
- 2. Hang the OK/HELP sign in your front window for First Responders to see.
 - 3. Close the window blinds or curtains.
- 4. Turn off all fans, heating, and air conditioning systems and close fireplace dampers.
- 5. Grab your home emergency kit and turn on the radio.
 - 6. Connect with your emergency contact.
- 7. Go to an interior room in your house and stay above-ground level, if you can. Avoid sheltering in basements as some chemicals weigh heavier than air and will linger in lower levels.
 - 8. Bring your pets with you. Be sure to have additional supplies for your pets as well.
- 9. Use duct tape and plastic sheeting to seal all cracks around the windows, doors, and vents into the room.
- 10. Monitor your radio, television, or Emergency Info BC until you are told by local officials it is safe or you are told to evacuate.
