


## RDBN Web Mapping Instructions

Our web mapping service provides access to spatial information across the RDBN. To access, simply visit [www.propertymap.ca](http://www.propertymap.ca), click “View Property Information Now”, then “I Agree”. You should now see the screen shown below.

The web map can be used to view the following data:

- Building Inspection Areas
- Zoning
- OCP Designations
- Addresses
- Municipal Boundaries
- Floodplains
- Hazard Areas
- ALR Lands



### Basic Navigation


1. Click and drag to move around
2. Scroll in/out to zoom

## To find a parcel by Address or Parcel Identifier (PID)


These steps will generate a report on the specified parcel containing information such as address, zoning, ALR status, and more.

- 1) Click on the search **tab** in the top left.

**Tip: Not the search bar in the top right!**




- 2) Click one of the four search options. Try searching the PMBC database first, then BCA.




- 3) Begin typing your search query, then choose the address or PID from the drop down. Click "Next."

**Tip: If you type the entire query then click next, it will not work.**





- 4) The parcel you searched will be highlighted yellow. The panel on the left will show information such as Plan number and PID.



- 5) Click the "Property Information Report" link. This will generate a report on the selected parcel.


- 6) Once the report is generated, click "Download Report", to open a new tab, then "Download", to download the file.




## How to view data on the map

You can display the data included in the report (and more!) as an image on the map.

- 1) Click the blue “I Want To...” box in the top left of the map window to bring up additional options



- 2) Click “Change visible Map Layers” from the menu



- 3) The panel on the left will change to show a table of contents of all the layers on the map. Each entry can be toggled between shown and hidden.

- a. A checkmark next to a layer indicates it is “on”, while an empty box indicates it is “off”.
- b. If a layer is greyed out, ensure the parent item’s box is checked.
- c. The “+” symbol next to some items can be clicked to show more layers.

**Tip:** If the box is checked & the layer is not greyed out, but it’s still not appearing, **you need to zoom in!**
