 - o Old Growth Strategic Renewal Meeting in April
- Fourth Annual Jordan Marshall Memorial Hockey Tournament in Fort St. James was held February 17th to 19th in support of mental health
- Fort St. James Snowmobile Club hosted a Poker Ride on February 18th with 235 hands given to riders.

<u>Village of Burns Lake</u> <u>-Update</u>

Director Wiebe gave an update regarding the Village of Burns Lake:

- Prince George Spruce Kings and Salmon Arm Silverbacks played two games at the Tom Forsyth Memorial Arena as part of the BC Hockey League's 2023 instalment of the league's Road Show on February 18th – 19th
- February 26th is the Burns Lake Centennial Ice Fishing Derby being hosted by Michels and Coastal GasLink
- Burns Lake in partnership with Lake Babine Nation was successful in receiving the Active Transportation Grant to complete its sidewalk project.

<u>Electoral Area G (Houston/</u> <u>Granisle Rural) – Update</u>

Director Newell provided the following update:

- Concerns regarding the mill closure announcement in Houston
 - Upcoming meeting to outline worker supports to be implemented
 - Wanting to ensure supports for all those impacted
- RCMP Survey plan to complete survey
- CBC contacted Director Newell requesting a comment regarding RCMP's involvement in the sabotage of Coastal GasLink Property in early 2022.

<u>District of Vanderhoof</u> <u>-Update</u>

Director Moutray noted that the District of Vanderhoof has been addressing the following:

- Old Growth Deferral and Biodiversity
 - Councillor Brian Frenkel has written a letter which will be sent today
 - Reviewed areas outlined in the Provincial mapping for Old Growth Deferral areas and the information in the mapping doesn't correlate with on the ground information.

Electoral Area A (Smithers Rural) – Update

Director Stoltenberg commented that he attended the Bulkley Valley Wild Game Banquet and has been working with various groups in the Regional District and Smithers area regarding grant funding.

VERBAL REPORTS AND COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORTS (CONT'D)

<u>Village of Granisle – Update</u>

Director McGuire provided the following update regarding the Village of Granisle:

- Held its quarterly Town Hall Meeting on February 21st
 - Provided the community with the utility needs for 2023
 - Only community in the north that continues to provide a discount to utility bills if residents pay their bill prior to April 30th
- Both the CAO and CFO have announced their retirement as of lune 30^{th}
 - Council has blended the position and the posting closes February 24th
- Babine Lake Community Forest provided both its partners, Lake Babine Nation and the Village of Granisle \$650,000 in funding:
 - Council will allocate 75% of the funding to municipal projects and 25% is being provided to community groups/initiatives over the next 2-3 years
- The Village's 50th Birthday took place during COVID so the community is planning a homecoming celebration in 2024
- Granisle Marina major restoration project
 - Grant funding has been approved by the Federal Government as well as matching funds from the Village of Granisle for 58 docks which have been ordered and will be installed.

<u>Village of Fraser Lake</u> <u>-Update</u>

Alternate Director Fennema provided the following update:

- received a tour of the upgrades to the Curling Rink/Community Hall Project
 - First Phase to be completed July 2023
- Partnership with CityWest for connectivity
- Village of Fraser Lake working on its Strategic Plan
- Forestry concerns in the community
- Family Day Celebrations
 - Good turnout despite the winter blizzard.

VERBAL REPORTS AND COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORTS

<u>Electoral Area B (Burns Lake Rural) – update</u>

Director Riis-Christianson reported the following:

- Participated in the Decriminalization of Illicit Drugs session hosted by the Union of B.C. Municipalities
 - Lack of answers regarding how local governments can address concerns and issues
 - Indicated that businesses and municipalities can request that individuals utilizing illicit drugs can be requested to remove themselves from a premises and if they refuse to leave RCMP/police may be called regarding trespassing
 - Communities can potentially develop a bylaw to address matters associated with the decriminalization of illicit drugs.

<u>Village of Telkwa – Update</u>

Director Dekens mentioned that the Telkwa Volunteer Fire Department has a children's program where they laminate pictures and place them on the outside of the fire trucks. There has been a lot of enthusiasm for the program.

Director Dekens noted that there is an upcoming Telkwa Coal Mine meeting at the beginning of March.

Director Dekens encouraged the Board to register for the Business Forum being held on March 28-29, 2023 in Telkwa, B.C.

<u>Electoral Area F (Vanderhoof</u> <u>Rural) – Update</u>

<u>Electoral Area F (Vanderhoof</u> Director Moon provided the following update:

- Toured Nechako Valley Exhibition Grounds in order to have an overview of the utilization of grant funding
- Vanderhoof Children's Theatre Performances
- Planning to attend the Nordic Ski Club to see the utilization of grant funds
- BC Livestock Cooperative Annual General Meeting
 - The Vanderhoof Auction Barn raised approximately
 \$30 million in sales
 - Three Auction Barns in the Province has raised approximately \$120 to \$130 million in beef sales
- Agriculture sector is one of the largest sectors in the Province
- Regional Cattlemen's Association Annual General Meeting
 - Discussed veterinarian shortages
- Bedding for Cattle
 - Auction in February had to be cancelled due to a lack of bedding material
 - Director Lambert assisted in securing a supply of bedding for the next auction.

<u>District of Fort St. James</u> -Update

Director Elphee spoke of the following:

- Fort St. James resident participated in the 2023 Iditarod Dog Sled Race and placed 4^{th}
- Nak'azdli Whut'en/District of Fort St. James Hockey Game February 25th.

Electoral Area E (Francois/ Ootsa Lake Rural) – Update

Director Lambert brought forward the following:

- Concerns regarding the impacts of the Province's commitment to protect 30% of the land base by 2030 in relation to old growth deferral and biodiversity considerations
- Good meeting with Cheslatta Carrier Nation, Nee Tahi Buhn and Skin Tyee Nation foresee continued collaboration moving forward
- Opening of the Post Office on the Southside
 - Open three days a week
 - Very positive
- - Agriculture bedding/shavings
 - Contacted Hampton Affiliates and West Fraser's
 Fraser Lake Sawmills and they indicated their
 willingness to provide shavings to assist with the next
 Beef Auction in Vanderhoof
 - Good to have corporate support in agriculture
 - Attended the Nechako Cattlemen's Annual General Meeting.

Town of Smithers - Update

Director Atrill noted the following:

- Smithers Exploration Group Rock Talk 2023 February 21-24, 2023 in Smithers
 - o In-person conference with over 100 people
- Town of Smithers Strategic Planning Session
 - Two-day process
 - o Planning additional time
- Town of Smithers has approved pursuing Heritage Registry
 - Will work to determine significant land marks/buildings
 - Provide information to people if homes/property are of historical value
 - No restrictions at this time
- New Bylaw Enforcement Officer has been hired
- Public consultation process regarding homelessness in the community with community and business members and the people involved in the encampments
- Tool Library recently opened at Ranger Park and will be open once a week
- Primary Care Clinic
 - o Nurse Practitioners
 - o Anticipate physicians working at the clinic as well.

 - As past minister of Finance and Municipal Affairs and Housing she is aware of the issues and opportunities
 - Spoke with Ian Patton, Shadow Minister of Agriculture and Food
