PROVINCIAL NOMINEE PROGRAM - Deb Zehr, Executive Director, Andrew Kemp, Engagement Specialist, Immigration Programs, and Aireen Luney, Manager of Program Development and Promotion Ministry of Municipal Affairs Immigration Services & Strategic Planning Division RE: Provincial Nominee Program – via Zoom

Chair Lambert welcomed Deb Zehr, Executive Director, Ministry of Municipal Affairs Immigration Services & Strategic Planning Division. Ms. Zehr introduced Andrew Kemp, Engagement Specialist, Immigration Programs and Aireen Luney, Manager of Program Development and Promotion, Ministry of Municipal Affairs Immigration Services & Strategic Planning Division RE: Provincial Nominee Program.

Ms. Zehr provided an overview of the BC Provincial Nominee Program (BC PNP). The Program is an economic immigration pilot program.

- Ability for the Province to design, administer and determine the criteria to nominate economic immigrants to the government for permanent residency
- The RDBN's past participation in the Pilot Program
- To attract entrepreneurs
- Currently 50 communities represented across the province with populations 75,000 or less.

- Pilot Program due to end in March 2024
  - o An external 3<sup>rd</sup> party evaluation is currently being conducted of the program
    - Input from communities valuable
  - COVID 19 pandemic Impacts to the program and processing times
  - Received over 118 applications
  - o 37 applications have arrived with families and are establishing business
  - Some applicants are at the end stage of the program and received permanent residency
  - o Challenges of a pilot program and learning
  - Managing the need for small communities
    - Relationship building with small communities is a benefit
    - Creating a profile of communities on the Provincial Nominee Program website
    - Noticing a shift of those coming to smaller communities due to on the ground support
  - o RDBN resuming participation in the Program
- Skills attraction a priority
  - Aware of labour pressures
  - Design mandate for the BC PNP is used to compliment the federal government administered pathways for temporary or permanent residents
    - Target people in certain occupations or sectors
      - Healthcare workers Health Authorities
      - Early Childhood Educators
      - Veterinarians and veterinarian technicians
    - Currently connecting with those individuals through the BC PNP
  - o Collaborating Connecting with Northern Development Initiative Trust
  - Continue to connect with federal programs to create pathways to bring workers to smaller centers
- Significant increase of immigrants to Canada and B.C.
- Challenges regarding accreditation for foreign workers
- Concerns about money laundering and sex trafficking through immigration programs
  - Fraud and Program Integrity
  - o Antifraud and Investigation Unit has been established
- Lack of housing and rental inventory in communities impacting the ability to recruit workers
- Entrepreneur and skilled worker streams
  - How to increase attraction and retention in small communities.
  - Working to horizontally collaborate between all stakeholders
- Repercussions if BC PNP applicants are unable to complete the program but remain in the community
  - o Process and review of BC PNP applicants.

# BC Provincial Nominee

<u>Program</u>

Director Parker brought forward the BC Provincial Nominee Program for discussion. He also mentioned having further

conversation with Deb Zehr, Executive Director, Ministry of Municipal Affairs Immigration Services & Strategic Planning Division regarding veterinarian shortages and the BC PNP program and skilled workers. The Committee directed staff to bring forward a memorandum at the

March 23, 2023 Board meeting for consideration.

## **Veterinary Drug Regulations**

Director Moon spoke of the Veterinary Drug and Medicated Feed Regulation program and that with the veterinarian shortages impacting the ability for farmers to administer medication to their herds this may be an area to research further. She noted that the regulations provide government with an opportunity to administer a veterinarian licence in areas where there are no professionals. Director Moon discussed researching possible options for areas experiencing veterinarian shortages.
