

Upon recommendations from BC Wildfire Service, an Evacuation Alert has been re-issued by Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Skin Tye Nation, and the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako for the following areas:

All lands and properties west of Brown Road to Morice Owen Service Road and Parrot FSR, including Owen Lake Road, east of Francois Lake, as shown on the attached map.

An Evacuation Alert has been issued to prepare you to evacuate your premises or property should it be found necessary. Residents will be given as much advance notice as possible prior to evacuation, however, you may receive limited notice due to changing conditions.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO WHILE THIS ALERT IS IN EFFECT



The Evacuation Order issued on July 23, 2023 at 1300 hours by Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Skin Tye Nation, and the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako is **rescinded for Trout Creek Road**.

The Evacuation Alert Amendment issued on July 26, 2023 at 1630 hours by Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Skin Tye Nation, and the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako **remains in place, as shown on the attached map**.

Things to consider bringing with you when returning home:

- Water for 7 days
- Food for 7 days
- Medications
- First Aid Kit
- Full tank of gas
- Pet food & supplies
- Cleaning supplies
- Air purifier (if available)

If you suffer from respiratory illness, consider delaying your return until air quality improves.

Tips from BC Hydro for returning home after an extended power outage:

- Avoid immediately turning on your heating system and numerous electronics and appliances as soon as the power is back. This gives the electrical system a chance to stabilize.
- Check food supplies in your refrigerator and freezer.
 - Check the [Canadian Food Inspection Agency](#) for information on handling refrigerated and frozen food after an outage.
 - A full fridge can keep food cold for about 4 hours.
 - A full freezer can keep food frozen for up to 48 hours; a half-full freezer will keep food frozen for about 24 hours.
- Reset your clocks, automatic timers, and alarms.
- Re-stock any supplies in your emergency kit that you used.
- If you experience problems with your power, call 1-800-BC HYDRO (1 800 224 9376).



Upon recommendations from BC Wildfire Service, the Evacuation Order issued by Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Skin Tye Nation, and the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako on July 19, 2023 at 1530 hours is amended for the following areas:

An Evacuation Order Expansion has been issued due to potential **danger to life and health** by Recreation Sites and Trails BC, Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Skin Tyee Nation and the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako. This expansion broadens the Evacuation Order area issued on **July 10, 2023 at 2000 hours** and is for the following area:

All lands and properties accessed by Colleymount Road between McClure Pit to and including 20448 Colleymount Road. This also includes lands and properties accessed by the Henkel Creek FSR as well as Nourse Creek Trail, McClure Pit and Government Point Recreation Sites and Trail as shown on the attached map

AND

All lands and properties located between the Morice Owen Service Rd and Parrott FSR, including Owen Lake Rd. east of Francois Lake as shown on the attached map.

YOU MUST LEAVE THE AREA IMMEDIATELY AND REGISTER AT THE RECEPTION AREA

Persons who disregard this Evacuation Order and remain in the Evacuation Order area do so at their own risk. The Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako may be unable to assist anyone who remains in the Evacuation Order area.

- If you need transportation assistance from the area please advise the individual providing this notice or call the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako at **250-692-1553**.
- Close all windows and doors.
- Shut off all gas and electrical appliances, other than refrigerators and freezers
- Close gates (latch) but do not lock.
- Gather your family: take a neighbour or someone who needs help.
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, wallet, and keys) only if they are immediately available. Take pets in pet kennels or on leash.
- Do not use more vehicles than you must.
- Do not use the telephone unless you need emergency assistance.
- If you require assistance for livestock, please call the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako at **250-692-1553**.

- If you have local friends or family to billet with, register at the Burns Lake Reception Centre at the **Lakeside Multiplex** at 103 Flogum Dr., Burns Lake or contact the Emergency Support Services Director at 250-692-9901.
