<u>BC Ambulance – Southside</u>	Director Lambert mentioned that with the new model for BC Ambulance staffing for rural communities the Southside BC Ambulance Station Chief will no longer be administering the Community Paramedic Program, as they need to be available to respond to emergency calls. Director Lambert spoke of the need to hire additional people.		
	Director McGuire noted that when the new Provincial program rolls out on April 1, 2024, the Community Paramedic Program will be a stand-alone program which was the intention of the program when it was first implemented.		
<u>Stuart Lake Hospital</u> <u>Replacement Project Meeting</u>	Director Elphee met with Chair Greenaway, RDBN staff, Northern Health, Fort St. James Primary Care, and Nak'azdli Whut'en regarding the transition to the new Stuart Lake Hospital in approximately 8 months. Director Elphee and Chair Greenaway have requested a virtual tour to provide clarity to the community in regard to the transition to the new facility.		
<u>Granisle Pharmacy</u>	Director McGuire commented that the Village of Granisle Council met with the new owner of the Pharmacy in Granisle. They have also purchased pharmacies in Fort St. James and the Southside of Francois Lake. She noted that it is exciting to have a Pharmacy being reestablished in the community.		
District of Vanderhoof-Update	 Director Moutray provided the following update: Licensed Practical Nurse 19 positions currently open in Vanderhoof In discussions with Megan Hunter, Health Services Administrator, Omineca, Northern Health to investigate the possibility of providing living costs to local individuals wanting to take the 2-year program Prerequisite for the program is Math 12 Currently the start wage is \$32.53 and after 10 years the wage is \$40.95. Stuart Nechako Manor Roof is nearing completion 30 person wait list for the facility Aurora Home Will be fully operational by the end of February with the 8 beds occupied.

RECOMMENDATION:

(all/directors/majority)

That Bylaw No. 88, being a bylaw to adopt the annual budget for 2024, be adopted this 7th day of March 2024.

That Bylaw No. 89 being a bylaw to provide funding for Vanderhoof Primary Care be given first, second, third reading and adopted this 7th day of March 2024.

BACKGROUND

The budget bylaw presented has been read the first time on January 11th, the second time on January 25th and third time on February 22nd.

This bylaw remains unchanged since third reading.

If the Board approves the annual budget bylaw, Bylaw 89 that provides funding towards the construction of the new Vanderhoof Primary Care building is recommended for three readings and adoption. This project provides working space, consultation rooms, and office space for primary health care workers in the Vanderhoof area. The board made a motion to bring forward a bylaw to support this project on June 8, 2023, upon approval of the 2024 budget. This bylaw imposes a maximum grant amount of \$5.282 million towards this project.
