The following was discussed:

- No profit recycling bale wrap
- Small profit from recycling twine higher value market
- Proposed federal regulations regarding plastics potentially coming into effect in 2025
  - Consideration of continuing the Pilot for an additional 3 years to await regulation roll out
- Shipping the products as quickly as possible with minimal storage of material
  - Budget Option 1: RDBN 2024-2027 Pilot Extension
    - Can adjust budget
    - Application to renew Canadian Agricultural Strategic Priorities Program (CASPP) funding
- Budget Option 2: RDBN 2024-2024 Pilot Extension
  - Regional District of Fraser Fort-George tonnages
    - o Comparison to RDBN
    - Challenging to compare due to differences between the programs
- Administration costs

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- Decrease in volume in 2022 and 2023
  - First year of pilot can see influx of material from product being stored
- Concerns regarding the potential for higher levels of government to change direction regarding Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) program and ICI (Industrial, Commercial, Institutional) recycling programs
- Data can be used for informing policy moving forward.

Chair Parker welcomed Andy Muma, President Houston Search and Rescue, Paul Broen, President, Fort St. James Search and Rescue, Lorn Kennedy, Search Manager, Nechako Valley Search and Rescue, Joan Burdeniuk, Regional Director, BC Search and Rescue.

#### Andy Muma, President – Houston SAR

- Moratorium on Search and Rescue capabilities
- Houston SAR wanting to develop canine search capability
  - Volunteer came forward wanting to achieve search dog capabilities and complete certification

#### SEARCH AND RESCUE- Andy Muma, President, Houston Search and Rescue, Paul Broen, President, Fort St. James Search and Rescue, Lorn Kennedy, Search Manager, Nechako Valley Search and Rescue, Joan Burdeniuk, Regional Director, BC Search and Rescue Association Re: Search and Rescue Capabilities (Cont'd)

- o Canine passed top of its class
- Support from RCMP, BC Search Dog Association, RDBN and neighbouring SAR teams
- Canines working life is approximately 6 years
- Training Certification need to be completed within one year of start
- Applied to the Ministry of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness (EMCR)
  - Application denied due to moratorium implemented ~ 3 years ago
  - Capabilities can only be approved by the EMCR Director
- Recently spoke to media and Nathan Cullen, MLA Stikine
- EMCR indicated it would conduct a needs assessment of all capabilities which has yet to occur
- SAR teams called to a search may not have the capabilities required due to the moratorium
- A list of SAR capabilities
- Search and Rescue is a tri-partnership
  - o SAR Team
    - Volunteers 24/7, 365 days of the year
    - Continued improvement after every search
    - Local funding and technical research
    - Community safety
  - o Local community
    - Provides the volunteers
    - Majority of funding through fundraising
  - o Province
    - ~\$5 million funding
    - WorkSafeBC and Workers Compensation
    - Basic training
    - Veto decision-making over-all search capabilities
- Value of local decision making.

Paul Broen, President Fort St. James SAR

- Capabilities removed since moratorium
  - No longer able to perform tracking capabilities
- Mr. Broen is a Tracking Instructor
- Challenges for SAR Teams to have capabilities removed
- Moratorium has been a challenge
- Neighbouring SAR Teams train in Fort St. James but due to Fort St. James SAR not having certain capabilities they are unable to train

Lorn Kennedy, Search Manager, Nechako Valley Search and Rescue

- Pervious team members trained in rope rescue
  - Spent considerable time, money and effort to travel to Prince George to train
  - Rope Rescue capability was removed
  - Demoralizing and impacts to volunteers who are passionate about providing search and rescue capabilities
- Use of drones put on hold due to moratorium
  - Region would benefit from the use of drones in search and rescue but unable to develop capability

The following was discussed:

- Provincial decision to implement moratorium
- Recent discussion with Nathan Cullen, MLA Stikine and Minister of Water, Lands and Resource Stewardship
- Lack of public response from EMCR
- Challenges for SAR Managers during search and rescue operations to explain inability to provide assistance
- EMCR SAR Unit
  - EMCR Director is located in Kamloops and has the authority to determine SAR Team capabilities
  - Two staff members
- Provincial supports
  - WorkSafe coverage
  - Stable funding
  - Basic training program
- Having more local government input regarding local SAR Team capabilities moving forward would be a benefit
- Funding formula and allocation based on capabilities
  - Over past 5 years funding has decreased and stayed consistent with inflation
- Moratorium implemented due to costs and liability
- Northern statistics for response times
  - Searches in the north often require further travel and are longer searches in comparison to southern B.C.
  - Unique differences between southern B.C. and northern B.C.
- Importance of having tracking and canine capabilities in northern B.C.
- Value of having water/ice capabilities due to the significant amount of water bodies in the region
- Value of residents and providing SAR capabilities in the region
- Volunteers want to provide various capabilities don't want to volunteer if unable to perform adequate search and rescue capabilities.

Joan Burdeniuk, Regional Director, BC Search and Rescue Association (BCSARA)

- BCSARA represents and advocates for all Search and Rescue Teams in BC
- Gap analysis was to be completed when the moratorium was implemented by the Province 3 years ago and has yet to take place
- BCSARA brought forward the issue to the media and EMCR has now indicated it will complete the gap analysis within the year
  - EMCR requesting RCMP to identify areas where SAR is unable to deliver capabilities/skills.

That the Board supports the submission of an application to the Union of BC Municipalities Community Emergency Preparedness Fund Emergency Operations Centre for the 2024 funding stream.

Further, the Board authorizes staff and understands that if the grant is approved, the RDBN will receive and manage all grant funding, and commits to any associated ineligible costs and cost overruns.

## BACKGROUND

The application deadline for the Union of BC Municipalities' (UBCM) Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) intake is February 23, 2024. Up to \$30,000 is available per local government to build local emergency response capacity through the purchase of equipment, supplies, training, and exercises.

## DISCUSSION

The grant funding provides an opportunity for the RDBN to increase the safety of our staff by proper identification and identifiable personal protective equipment (PPE). Staff had issues during the 2023 wildfire season with external agencies and public questioning the validity of RDBN EOC staff deployed into the field, attending BCWS meetings, and conducting damage assessments. Communications between field staff and EOC was an issue, improving the radios and satellite phones staff have access to will mitigate some risks of the required work during emergencies. Headsets for EOC phones were requested to reduce background noise and hearing issues in the EOC room. The total project budget is \$29,157.50.

The grant application requires a resolution from the local government indicating support for the activities in the proposed project.
