NEED ASSISTANCE?

If you need assistance to evacuate call neighbours, friends, and family that can help you. Be sure to wear your medical alert tags and have medication and equipment ready to go.

EVACUATION ORDER AREA PERMIT

Temporary access to an Evacuation Order area may be permitted on a case-by-case basis. Contact the RDBN Emergency Information Line 250-692-1553 to apply. Minors are NOT allowed to be included in the Permit.

Types of permits that could be approved are:

- Essential Service Access
- Agriculture Access
- Pass-Through
- Basic Necessities Drop-Off

A person entering the Evacuation Order area may require a qualified escort. Each individual seeking access must sign a liability waiver.

Once the approved activity is completed, you must leave the area.



WHAT IS AN EVACUATION ORDER?

Due to an immediate danger to life and health, the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako has issued an Evacuation Order for your area.

You MUST leave the area immediately. By law, all minors are required to leave an Evacuation Order area.

While the Evacuation Order is in place, you will not be allowed to return to your home until the Evacuation Order has been rescinded. The Evacuation Order contains a map of the area being evacuated and the location of the Emergency Support Services Reception Centre. This brochure and your Evacuation Order Package contain information to aid you in the evacuation process.



You MUST leave the area immediately:

- Gather your family and consider taking a neighbour or someone who needs help.
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, cellphone, wallet, and keys) if they are immediately available.
- Always take pets with you.

EVACUATION CHECKLIST

- Be sure all windows and doors are shut and locked.
- Shut off gas and electrical appliances other than fridges and freezers.
- Move propane tanks away from buildings in the event of a wildfire.
- Make sure your address is posted at the end of driveway.
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, wallet, and keys) only if they are immediately available. Take pets in pet kennels or on a leash.
- Leave a note saying you have evacuated.
- Close gates (latch) but do not lock.
- Contact your house or renters insurance provider to determine if you have evacuation coverage.

FINAL STEPS

Once you have evacuated, go to the Reception Centre identified in the Evacuation Order to register your family with Emergency Support Services (ESS).

You may be eligible for support such as:

- Accommodations (group lodging/hotels)
- Food (restaurants or grocery)
- Incidentals (toiletries)
- Help with finding family members

By registering with ESS you will receive notification when the emergency is over and when you then can go home.
