Do You Have a Pet Emergency Kit?



Emergencies happen. Your best strategy in dealing with a disaster is to be as prepared as possible beforehand. You should be able to take care of your pets for up to a week. Ideally, your kit should be stored in a waterproof container. You may have to shelter in place without electricity, water, or may have to evacuate your home for a period of time.

Prepare an Emergency Evacuation Kit for your Pets containing:

- Three days of food and water for each animal
- Feeding dishes
- Disposable litter trays
- Litter and/or paper towels
- Disposable garbage bags
- A traveling bag, crate or carrier for each pet
- Medications and medical records
- Contact information for your veterinarian
- Pet first aid kit
- Extra leash/harness
- Favorite toys
- A photo of your pet



Make sure all your pets wear collars and/or identification tags with up-to-date information. ID tags should contain your pet's name, your phone number and any urgent medical needs.



In the event of an evacuation, <u>do not</u> leave your pets behind.
