Protection:

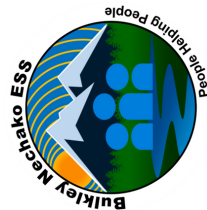
All ESS volunteers receive *WorkSafe BC* and liability insurance coverage while on assignments.

EMERGENCY SUPPORT SERVICES

Emergency Support Services (ESS) are critical to an emergency response. ESS provides temporary support and assistance to residents who are displaced due to an emergency event.

Events may vary from a structure fire to large evacuations due to flooding or wildfires etc.

All residents of British Columbia are eligible for ESS services.

ESS ASSISTANCE

ESS Volunteers respond to emergencies and disasters and provide:

- Emergency accommodations or shelter.
- Food and other necessities such as clothing and medication.
- The distribution of current event information.



ESS PROGRAM

ESS is a service provided by municipal ESS Teams and in partnership with the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako. ESS programs are administered through trained volunteers who dedicate time to their community.

ESS Volunteers are considered Public Safety Lifeline Volunteers through the Province of BC.

COMMITMENT

Until activated by an emergency, being part of your local ESS team is a relatively low commitment. Each team is managed by an Emergency Support Services Director. ESS volunteers make the following commitments:

- Attend ESS training provided by your local government and the Province of BC.
- Attend monthly meetings.
- Be available to respond to emergency events when possible.
- Participate in occasional volunteer appreciation, recruitment and public education events.
